

A note from St Cecilia Orchestra, Ripon

We are writing to introduce you to Ripon's St Cecilia Orchestra, and to let you know about part of our outreach programme. We believe passionately that all children should have access to music the benefits are well known, such as improving concentration, confidence and social skills. Unfortunately music is often overlooked in the curriculum, with time constraints and costs preventing many children benefitting from the advantages of musical experiences. A part of our programme is to invite children and their parents (or guardians) to open rehearsals on the Saturday afternoon before the final evening performance. These are held either in Ripon Cathedral or Holy Trinity Church, Ripon. The rehearsal is from 2pm – 5pm. Come along for a few minutes, or the whole rehearsal. Children are welcome to sit right at the front – bring a cushion! At breaks in the rehearsal, feel free to ask questions to anyone, including members of the orchestra. There is no need to book or let us know – just turn up. It's free! We would of course be delighted if the children want to come to the concert in the evening. They and their parents will receive a very warm welcome, and children are free! The next concert is: 22nd October – Anniversary Gala Concert, at Ripon Cathedral

To celebrate 21 years since the "official" formation of St Cecilia Orchestra, we offer a spectacular programme including Tchaikovsky's "1812" Overture, Bruch's Violin Concerto with the wonderful violinist Tasmin Little - and finishing with the complete "Planets Suite" by Gustav Holst! You may know that the famous 1812 Overture is a commemoration of Russia's defence against Napoleon, and involves canon shots. We will have a genuine canon in the cathedral – though we won't be firing it of course! We hope that experiencing the sound and excitement of a symphony orchestra will inspire some of your children to want to learn to play an instrument, or simply instil an appreciation and enjoyment of music which they may not otherwise encounter. A note from North Yorkshire Police

Terrifying 'knocker' SCAM:

Police forces across the country have been issuing alerts after a wave of crimes involving gangs of men who claim to be selling cleaning products but actually are scoping out the victims house in preparation for a burglary at a later date. The scam often involves sellers – also known as Nottingham Knockers – who claim to be a reformed convict trying to make a new life for themselves or to be deaf or dumb and in need of cash to pay for their carer. The crooks go between houses appearing to offer a range of cleaning products but are secretly checking how much cash may be in the house, whether the home is occupied or empty at certain times, how valuable the belongings are and how well protected the house is. A few days or weeks later, a different member of the gang returns to burgle the house using the intelligence gathered by the initial doorstep trader. Some scammers reportedly even sniff the bank notes they are paid with to judge whether they may have come from a larger wad of cash being stored somewhere in the house. So-named because the original scammers hailed from Nottingham and would come knocking door-to-door to trade their wares, the scam has spread across the country, sparking a number of police alerts. Forces across the country have issued warnings to vulnerable residents, especially the elderly, to be on their guard. In some cases doorstep hawkers have forced their way inside a property after being told to go away. Those who do pay up risk being added to a list of willing customers and are then targeted by other street sellers. More information can be found at:
